## Programs

The N. C. Council for Women administers domestic violence and sexual assault awareness intervention programs that help individuals rebuild their lives. The Council administers the Family Violence Prevention & Services program federal funding which supports North Carolina domestic violence shelters and innovative prevention programs.

The courts refer domestic violence offenders to abuser treatment programs which are certified by the N.C. Council for Women. Communities without a program are encouraged to learn more about the certification process to extend the network of abuser treatment programs.

## Statewide Boards

### ***N.C. Council for Women***

The 20-member Council Board, appointed by the Governor, addresses issues including health, education, employment and safety of women in North Carolina, with a special emphasis on prevention of violence against women.

### ***Domestic Violence Commission***

The 39-member Commission assesses statewide needs related to domestic violence and sexual assault. In collaboration with the Council, the Commission works to strengthen existing domestic violence and sexual assault programs while also examining the unmet needs of women and families in their effort to live in a violence-free environment.
