

Beginning March 1 State Surplus Property will begin offering select property to the second high bidders.

In the past, when a bidder failed to pay for his property in the 15 days allowed, the property was offered to the general public on our Default Board at the SSPA facilities in Raleigh. Customers could buy the property at the defaulted bid price. Not any more. Beginning March 1st, the State Surplus Property Agency will begin offering default property to the second highest bidder.

Second Highest Bidders will be awarded property in the following way:

1. The second highest bidder will be contacted by email and must respond via email within 2 business days to claim the property.
2. If the second highest bidder does not wish to claim the property or doesn't respond to the email, the property will be reprocessed
3. If the second highest bidder defaults on another bid at anytime while this property is in the awarded status, he will not be eligible to purchase the property. Even if he pays the resell fee to reinstate his bidding privileges.
4. Seized property will not be available for second highest bid sales.
5. All other SSPA Terms and Conditions still apply. SSPA reserves the right to reject any bid that does not meet the expect value or the minimum set by the selling agency.

This change will apply to surplus property across the State of North Carolina. From Murphy to Manteo, property will be available.
