Mounted Patrol Horse - "Eli" is a Registered Solid Bay 16.2 Hand Appaloosa Gelding, Born in April of 1997. He is registered under the Name Multiplicity and has the Impressive Line in His Pedigree.

NCSU got Eli in Sept. of 2005. He was previously used as a Hunter Jumper. During the time he has been used full time as a Patrol Horse. He has had hundreds of hours of specialized police and desensitization training. He is the senior horse on the unit and can be quite pushy at times.



Eli is a horse that needs an experienced horse knowledgeable handler on the ground. It is advised that anyone interested in Eli should come and look at him and ride him. ****Please call and make an appointment with Andrea Foor at the NCSU Mounted Police, Phone #919-271-4409 or E-mail: akfoor@gw.ncsu.edu ****

He is HYPP H/N, which means Hyperkalemic periodic paralysis. (HYPP) is an inherited disease of the muscle which is caused by a genetic defect. In the muscle of affected horses, a point mutation exists in the sodium channel gene and is passed on to offspring. He has had one episode of a minor seizure as it relates to his HYPP. He was placed in the stocks at the Vet School to have his teeth floated, as the other horse was being worked on he seemed to be getting agitated. When we brought him back to the barn he started showing signs of the seizure. The handler recognized it immediately and gave him the appropriate medicine. Since then, he has had no seizures and has his teeth done in an open stall. He has been thru numerous stressful situations and has had no problems. We monitor his potassium intake and he is fed timothy hay. He is on a feed that contains a glucosamine supplement for his joints because of working on pavement. It is recommended he stay on the glucosamine supplement, when we took him off he got stiff in the back end. He had his front legs x-rayed 3 weeks ago and they showed several small fractures to the coffin bones and a slight rotation of the navicular bone, and mild inflammation due to a possible founder at one point. He is currently sound for light riding. We should add that they have a contact number for a farrier, as this can be assisted with good farrier work. He is currently sound for light riding now.

He has never had any issues with colic. He did have a small puncture to his left eye in March, which was treated and has since recovered fully. He has a few scrapes on his knees currently from tripping on the sidewalk. Those are healing just fine. He is current on all vaccines, coggins, worming. He trailers just fine. He is ok with shots so long as a treat follows his good behavior. He gets along fine with mares and is normally the lead horse with geldings.

It is recommended for his living conditions, He should have the availability of turn out on a pasture, of at least 2 acres. Turn out at least 50% of the time. He can be in a stall, but it will not be good for his legs to stay in a stall 100% of the time.

Jobs for Eli would be light riding, lead line, desensitization demos, therapeutic riding, and light lesson horse.

Jobs NOT for Eli would be jumping, long distance endurance rides, speed competitions, barrel racing, cattle work, dressage, trail rides involving street riding, driving.

It is recommended he should be placed with an experience rider/horse person.
