


WHO ARE WE HELPING?

67,847 Clients received in-person or remote services



WHAT ARE THE SERVICES?

The most services provided were **information** (255,000) and **advocacy** (140,000 cases).



Volunteers donated **178,185** hours.²

Organizations also provided public-facing services, including **2,386** educational presentations and **2,172** professional trainings.³




RACE

AGE




SERVICES PROVIDED

The most common type of service was **providing information**, with nearly 68,000 cases. **Advocacy** was second most common, with over 29,000 cases. Other services included **24,877** calls and **2,404** chats on hotlines, as well as:



OFFENDER

Of the 10,894 reported offenders in cases of sexual assault, only 4% of assaults were perpetrated by strangers.



Volunteers donated **139,071** hours.²
