

**Family Violence Prevention and Services Act
Domestic Violence Services Disaster Assistance and Recovery Supplemental
Funding Hurricanes Fiona and Ian
Funding Announcement**

The Division for Women and Youth (DW&Y) is pleased to announce the availability of supplemental funding through the FVPSA Hurricanes Fiona and Ian Domestic Violence Services Disaster Assistance and Recovery Supplemental Funding (Year 2).

Purpose and Program Overview

The North Carolina Department of Administration (NCDOA) received a FVPSA supplemental award of \$833,334.00 through the Administration for Children and Families for disaster assistance and recovery in response to Hurricanes Ian and Fiona, which directly impacted southeastern North Carolina in September 2022. The DW&Y distributed grant funds in FY2025-2026. In addition, DW&Y awarded \$150,000 to a qualified hurricane/disaster expert to develop hurricane preparedness materials tailored to North Carolina's geography and needs. The disaster preparation kit will be available soon and distributed for use to domestic violence shelters across the state.

The goal for Year II is to award the remaining funds to domestic violence shelters and service providers in areas impacted by hurricanes Fiona and Ian. Funds can be utilized for housing assistance, supportive services, and facility recovery, and to support future emergency preparedness in the same area of the state. This funding opportunity is limited to providers located in or serving people in the 20 counties that comprise southeastern North Carolina, as defined below.

For applicants who received Year I Hurricane Fiona & Ian funding:

- If the purpose of the project remains the same, only submit a new project budget.
- If the purpose of the project has changed, you must submit a new application along with a new budget.

Project Period:

August 1, 2026 – June 30, 2027 (Retroactive Pre-award expenses from as early as September 14, 2022 are allowed and will require permission)

Eligibility:

Eligible applicants must be a non-profit, government agency, or culturally specific program or tribal organization that has a demonstrated history of domestic violence service delivery and must meet the following criteria:

Be located in or serve one or more of the following southeastern North Carolina counties that were most directly impacted by Hurricanes Ian and Fiona—Anson, Bladen, Brunswick, Columbus, Craven, Cumberland, Duplin, Hoke, Jones, Lenoir, Montgomery, Moore, New Hanover, Onslow, Pender, Richmond, Robeson, Sampson, Scotland, and Wayne.

Be a current Domestic Violence Center Fund state grantee or FVPSA subgrantee in good standing.

Funding Availability:

From the remaining grant balance of \$395,414, eight (8) grants are available. The amount of the individual grant award is \$49,426.

Award Amount: \$49,426

Type of Award: Supplemental award to existing NC Division for Women & Youth State funding grantees serving survivors within the 20 southeastern North Carolina counties most impacted by Hurricanes Ian and Fiona: **Anson, Bladen, Brunswick, Columbus, Craven, Cumberland, Duplin, Hoke, Jones, Lenoir, Montgomery, Moore, New Hanover, Onslow, Pender, Richmond, Robeson, Sampson, Scotland, and Wayne.**

Requirements:

FVPSA Hurricanes Fiona and Ian Domestic Violence Services Disaster Assistance and Recovery Supplemental Funding supplemental grant recipients are required to submit pre-award documents related to the funding. Pre-award documents consist of the supplemental funding application and a project narrative/scope of work which must be uploaded with the grant application form into the EBS by July 3, 2026. The application documents are available on the Division for Women and Youth website.

Reporting:

Performance Progress Report (PPR) is due by October 15, 2026. This is a mandatory report and will detail the implementation and allocation of the FVPSA Hurricanes Fiona and Ian Domestic Violence Services Disaster Assistance and Recovery Supplemental Funding (Year 2) your agency received.

Purpose and Use of the Award Funds:

- Shelter, housing assistance, and temporary rental assistance
- Provision of essential services, basic advocacy, and support for survivors and their children
- Support for the operation and administration of domestic violence supportive services
- Enhancement of capacity to provide culturally and linguistically appropriate services during a disaster or as a result of disaster impact and addressing racial disparities exacerbated by a disaster or as a result of disaster impact
- Modernization of existing facilities, which includes alteration, minor renovation, minor remodeling, improvement, expansion, or repairs necessary to make a facility more resistant to future natural disasters or more suitable and accessible to persons with limited mobility
- Emergency preparedness and response, such as facility alterations, renovation, construction, and/or disaster-resistant infrastructure
- Materials, supplies, and equipment

a. Allowable Use of Funds

- Temporary rental or emergency housing assistance.
- Shelter operations and facility repairs.
- Mold remediation and essential renovations.
- Emergency preparedness supplies, infrastructure, and planning.
- Emergency transportation, food, and supplies.
- Supportive services for survivors and children.
- Workforce support and capacity for crisis response.

b. Unallowable Uses of Funds:

- Property purchases
- Direct cash payments to survivors
- Services not directly tied to disaster recovery or preparedness
