RE: Emergency Declaration – Temporary full breach of Gables Dam that was damaged during Tropical Storms Julia and Hermine and Hurricane Matthew

Mr. Jackson:

Under the provisions of 01 North Carolina Administrative Code 30D .0302(e), the Department of Environmental Quality (NCDEQ) has issued an emergency declaration for the Gables Dam in Cumberland County (Latitude 35.1101, Longitude -78.8896). In addition, NCDEQ's Division of Energy, Mineral and Land Resources (DEMLR) plans to exercise its authority under NCGS §143-215.32(c) and NCGS §143-64.31(a) to conduct a temporary full breach of the dam due to its current deficiencies, which if left uncorrected, could result in a failure causing loss of life and significant property damage downstream.

After Tropical Storms Julia and Hermine and Hurricane Matthew, DEMLR inspections confirmed that damage had occurred to 68 dams in North Carolina. Of those 68 dams, 22 were breached and 46 were damaged and in need of repair. More than 400 inspections were conducted during a 16-day period by DEMLR staff. The Gables Dam is one such dam and is in need of immediate action to abate the risk of loss of life and significant property damage downstream.

In its current condition, with the reservoir at normal pool, it would take only 2.11 inches of rain in a 24-hour period to completely overtop the dam, which could lead to the continuation of the current head cutting of the embankment and thus cause the dam to breach.

Independent breach analyses completed by North Carolina Dam Safety show that there could potentially be 86 parcels within the inundation area of the Gables Dam. North Carolina Dam Safety used the 2014 county parcel data to estimate that the total damage could be in excess of \$767,700. The total value is based on parcel data that may not have been updated lately and it should be noted that not all parcels had values associated with

them. In addition, this estimate does not take into account the value of infrastructure that could be damaged such as highways, bridges, utility lines, private septic systems, pools, etc. or county and state property that has not been assessed by the tax office.

Under this declaration, the Department intends to expedite the procurement of qualified dam engineers for the design and construction oversight for the temporary full breach of the damaged Gables Dam and which currently needs to be breached to protect life and property downstream.

Dear Mr. Jackson:

The Royster Building on the original Cherry Hospital campus was flooded and sustained water damage to its electrical equipment during Hurricane Matthew. Royster is a 103,000 SF four-story building with a basement and was built in 1962. The building houses administrative and facility maintenance support functions which are critical to the effective operation of the New Cherry Hospital. The Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) obtained the services of a design firm, Sigma Engineering, to complete a study to evaluate the extent of the flood damage and to develop a project scope of work and corresponding construction cost estimate for completing all recommended restoration work. After allowing time for the equipment to sufficiently dry out, Sigma Engineering visited the site to start their inspection and evaluation of the electrical equipment. Based on the findings of Sigma Engineering, the electrical equipment needs to be replaced to ensure that the building is being provided with reliable electrical power. The Royster Building had to be evacuated since the water damaged electrical equipment has resulted in an unreliable fire alarm system for the building creating an unsafe condition for building occupants. The water damaged electrical equipment is also unable to provide reliable power for the existing heating, ventilation, and air conditioning (HVAC) systems serving the building. The existing air handling unit located in the basement provides the first and second floors with HVAC. This air handling unit suffered water damage from the hurricane, and it is not operational. Without sufficient HVAC, the humidity of the air inside the building cannot be maintained at a proper level. High humidity levels create the potential for mold growth inside the building resulting in an unhealthy environment for building occupants. Insufficient HVAC will also damage the building materials including the interior finishes. The work to restore the basement air handling unit is being completed under separate contract from the work to replace the electrical equipment of the building.

Pursuant to the Administrative Code NCAC 30D.0302(e) for Special Procedures for Emergency Projects and for the reasons stated above, DHHS has declared the need to expedite replacing the electrical equipment of the Royster Building as an emergency project to avoid a hazard to persons or property and to allow the Royster Building to be occupied for the purpose of providing critical administrative and facility maintenance support services required for the effective operation of the New Cherry Hospital.

Dear President Spellings:

On April 4, 2017, a fire occurred in the stage area of the UNCG Auditorium (Complex 1-41-6, Asset 6). The fire was contained promptly with fire extinguishers. However, the fire burned curtains, exposed rigging and electrical systems to high heat, and caused smoke damage in the facility. In addition, the fire suppression chemical discharged by the fire extinguishers spread over finishes and electronic equipment in the building.

A representative from the Department of Insurance visited the site on April 5th, 2017 and the State Electrical Inspector will assess the electrical distribution systems exposed to high heat today. Rigging inspections have been scheduled. Arrangements are being made with specialty contractors to address the smoke damage and removal of the fire extinguisher chemical.

The UNCG Auditorium is an essential facility for a number of programs in the College of Visual and Performing Arts; therefore, it is critical to restore it to use as soon as possible.

This letter is to inform you that I am invoking emergency procedures in accordance with Article VII, Paragraph F of the University of North Carolina Design and Construction Guidelines and as allowed by G.S. 143-129, to address the necessary health and safety repairs and restore operation of the facility.
