## 15. STATE CONSTRUCTION OFFICE REPORT

- Michael Shumsky (Director for State Construction Office) stated SCO was reviewing and approving OC-25's of State Agencies for the FY 2025-26 Repairs and Renovations (R&R) requests in advance of the OSBM October 10, 2025 deadline.
- The 45th Annual State Construction Conference is scheduled for March 5, 2026 at the McKimmon Training Center in Raleigh.
- William Johnson provided current DHHS Campus project (Phase I) schedule status: NC DHHS move-in is anticipated to be completed by October 15, 2025. This is ahead of the contractual completion date of December 22, 2025. The number of employees relocated was approximately 1,800, which included 300 from the Greater Triangle area.
- Michael Ali (Assistant Director of Construction Management / FCAP) informed the committee of a previous (5+ years ago) change to the "State Construction Office Contractor Evaluation Matrix" form. The form's scoring scale was changed to 0 300. Part 01 30F .0305 of the NC Administrative Code was never modified and uses single digit scoring scale like 1, 2, 3, etc. An example of the form was presented, and commission members were informed that the form is essentially unusable without proper harmonization. The Contractor Evaluation Matrix applies to all Construction Contracts and is the primary contractor accountability tool available to State owners. The form's scoring scale will be made to align with the NC Administrative Code. A complete update form will be presented to the SBC for approval at the next scheduled normal meeting on October 28, 2025.
- Vibha Goel (Assistant Director Design Review Section) provided a report with an overview of key activities within the Design Review Section, including submittals received, responses issued, and exemption requests processed and tent permits processed from January 1, 2025 through August 25, 2025.




