Minutes of the Meeting October 25, 1950

The Eugenics Board met in Room 526 of the Education Building at 2:00 p.m., Wednesday, October 25. The following persons were present: Dr. E. N. Pleasants, Superintendent, State Hospital at Raleigh; Dr. Ira C. Long, Superintendent, State Hospital Goldsboro; Dr. John H. Hamilton, representing Dr. J. W. R. Norton, State Health Officer; Mr. Clifton Beckwith, representing Harry McMullan, Attorney General; and R. Eugene Brown, representing Dr. Ellen Winston, Commissioner of Public Welfare.

In the absence of Dr. Winston, Chairman, Dr. E. N. Pleasants was designated acting chairman.

Minutes of the meeting of September 27 were read and approved. The Executive Secretary gave a report of activities of the past month. (See copy attached).

An article written by Professor Bradway, Legal Aid Clinic, Duke University, was printed in the Medical Journal of the North Carolina State Medical Association. Reprints have been made by Human Betterment League. One of these reprints was given to Mr. Beckwith. The article indicated that there was nothing in the North Carolina law which prevented doctors from performing sterilization operations when consents were given. It implied that the only cases which needed to be referred to the Eugenics Board would be contested cases. Mr. Beckwith pointed out that the thing which Prof. Bradway failed to take into consideration was the common law relating to mayhem. It was the opinion of the board that no action should be taken regarding the article which is being circulated in the state.
